History

The Land on which Lions Village Licola now sits was once a working sawmill and thriving community. Over time, it was abandoned and left derelict. In 1969 it was purchased on behalf of the Lions Clubs in Victoria. During the next 4 years magnificent displays of generosity in terms of both labor and means transformed Licola into the beautiful Village we have today.

In 1973 the first Lions sponsored camp of 40 children was held at the site. Since then it is estimated that thirty-five thousand people of varying ages have attended Lions sponsored camps at Licola. All but a handful of these camps have been staffed by volunteers.

Lions Village Licola aims to provide challenging and enjoyable experiences. We believe that individuals respond well to an environment suited to their needs. Our leaders are well trained, enthusiastic and imaginative and provide a safe and supervised environment based on the principles of respect, responsibility, caring and honesty.

Who can participate:

* *Children who are 8 - 11 years old* and have not attended a Lions Sponsored Camp in the last 12 months.

* All children who are able to participate in group instruction, live in a community setting, and who can function within a supervision ratio of 1:6.

Selection of suitable children is on a first come first serve basis providing the following processes have been followed:

1. You have forwarded relevant paperwork to your nominating Lions Club Representative.
2. You have received confirmation of acceptance from your nominating Lions Club.

Activities

Activities offered include giant swing, raft building and canoeing, high and low ropes courses, climbing wall, flying fox, arts and crafts activities, campfires and outdoor cooking, giant outdoor games, indoor activities in the sports stadium, archery, mini golf, trampolines, Trivia night, and camp concert

Meals

Licola is famous for its ability to serve delicious meals for large numbers while ensuring a healthy well balanced menu. Please make a note on the Enrolment form if your child requires special dietary considerations. All meals are served in our large community dining hall.

Accommodation

Accommodation is in sixteen (16), 3-4 bedroom cottages that each have ample sleeping and shower facilities for 11 - 17 people. All campers are able to get a full night's rest and wake up the following morning for another activity filled day. Campers and volunteers are required to bring their own sleeping bag/blankets and pillows.

Services at Licola

Licola is a small village. There is one shop that provides general supplies to locals and tourists. No other services are available.

Mobile phones do not work at Licola and newspapers are not available. A coin operated pay telephone is available in the Camp.
